Health and Wellness Council Formed

The Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 (HHFKA) requires all school districts to establish and implement local school wellness policies that meet minimum standards designed to promote sound nutrition, student health, reduce childhood obesity, and provide transparency to the public on the school nutrition environment. A health and wellness council formed with Harold Richardson - Chair, Sandy Weyers, Stan Karr, Nancy Harms and Sarah Bredthauer. Mr. Richardson and Mrs. Weyers attended a meeting with other ESU 4 schools to share ideas about best practices in promoting student health and to reduce childhood obesity. This council will be reporting to the board of education at the March meeting.

Preschool Grant Application

I completed the application and sent it into the Nebraska Department of Education requesting \$60,000 of Early Childhood Education Funds. If successful in getting the grant approved, Sterling Public Schools will be able to expand the preschool program to full-time. This means five days a week and all day for 3 and 4 year olds. The review teams will be rating the competitive grant applications and school districts will find out in early May if they are successful or not in getting the grant. This grant would be \$60,000 for three years for a total of \$180,000.




