## SUPERINTENDENT Notes by Mr. Knippelmeyer

## Summary of March 2I, 2016 Board Meeting:

- Mr. Davenport presented on the start-up of FBLA, what has been accomplished this year and State Leadership Conference.
- March Board Commendations: Stephanie Parde for her work in organizing Dr. Seuss week for the elementary, Gladys Kuhlmann for her work as a substitute teacher for the district, and Teresa Haynes for her work as an assistant volleyball coach, as she has decided to step down from that position.
- The Board approved: NASB membership for 2016-17, ESU 4 Core Services and Special
 Education Services for 2016-17.
- We are moving forward with the use of E-meetings as a way to facilitate all board meetings in the future.
- State Aid has been certified for 2016-17. There were no surprises...we are not getting any state aid next year.
- Gym repair updates were shared. Gym floor refinishing began on March 23 and will be a 2-3 week process. We are hoping to move the bleacher installation up a week if possible. We hope to have these projects completed by the last week of April. We will look at having an open house for the public to come see the gym and bleachers when all work is finished.
- Discussion on Facilities - The board had a productive discussion about our facilities and the current reality of enrollment in our primary grades. Gill Peace is our architect and we will be asking him to put together layouts for what it would look like to add on to our building on the SE corner and the cost of that, along with the cost of replacing the current preschool portable with a new portable or a pre-built steel building. We will also be asking Gill to put together a drawing and costs to knock down the current kitchen overhang and possibly putting up something new there.
The April Board meeting has been moved to Thursday, April I4 at 7:30.
Last Day of School in May: As you are aware, there are three days built into the school calendar for inclement weather. So far this year, we have had one snow day. If no additional snow days are used, our last day of school will be Wednesday, May 18. There will be a noon dismissal on the last day of school.

Marzano Academy Recap: All of our Preschool - $12^{\text {th }}$ grade teachers and administrators have completed the six-day Marzano Instructional Framework Academy. The goal of this professional development was to implement a consistent instructional framework and language across all grade levels and content areas in Sterling Public Schools. Now that we have completed the training, the implementation process is just beginning and will carry over throughout the next school year. We will be partnering with our professional development colleagues at ESU 4 throughout the next school year in developing district and individual goals that align with the Framework and we will be using many of the teacher in-service days and Wednesday early outs next year to work closely with ESU staff in developing, monitoring, and checking progress for the goals that we establish.

## AG/ECON CLASS FIELD TRIP

The Sterling Ag Econ class took a two day field trip to visit 3 major Ag facilities in central Nebraska. The first Ag facility that we toured was the Case IH combine factory in Grand Island. This is the only manufacturing plant in the world that makes Case IH combines. They are currently making 12 per day down from 30 per day 3 years ago. This is due to the slowdown in the farm economy as a result of low commodity prices. This plant makes the majority of components for the combine but do import engines from Germany and
 Italy (Manfre was proud).


Our next tour was in Central City and the ethanol plant. They use approximately 180 semi-loads of corn each day and have a labor force of 50 employees that work 3 shifts 7 days a week. Just before we arrived they have a malfunction but were back up and running in less than 1 hour. They ship most of their ethanol out by rail.

Our final tour was on Friday and we visited the DuPont Pioneer International production facility in York. From the road it does not appear to be too large but after walking the tour we all were very impressed with the immense size of the processing plant. They plan the planting of the seed corn, the harvest of the seed corn all the way to the distribution to the dealers and ultimately the delivery to the farmer.

Each tour took about $21 / 2$ hours each and the one common element of each Ag facility was the use of technology. The students on this tour are now well aware of the many career opportunities that the farm culture offers besides production agriculture. We want to thank DuPont Pioneer International and Greg Carpenter for setting up the tours and sponsoring the two day extravaganza. The students that participated in the trip were Austin Buss, Manfre Scattoni, Jacob Schwenneker, and Micah Erickson (who enjoyed the Eel Sushi).
