DECEMBER 2017

District News Update by Superintendent, Dottie Heusman

The Board of Education met on November 20, 2017. Board Members Agena, Harms, and Wirthele shared information about the Nebraska Association of School Boards Annual Convention that was held in Omaha on November 16 and 17. Members Harms and Hestermann reported on the first teacher negotiations meeting. Members Agena and Wirthele shared information about the Americanism Meeting that was held in November with Principal Harrington and Mr. Wusk.

During the teacher reports, Mr. Boldt and Mrs. Salberg shared information about the various safety teams at Sterling Public Schools. This includes the Crisis Team, CPI Team, Safety Team, and Building and Grounds Team. All staff members that serve on these teams do so without additional compensation. These teams are critical to the success of the school.

In faculty reports Mrs. Addie Heusman, Guidance Counselor shared information about the EducationQuest's Apply2College campaign that our seniors participated in on October 23, the changes that have been made to the Student Assistance Team (SAT), and the ACT test for juniors. Mr. Brent Heusman reported on the number of athletes out for Junior High Boys Basketball, and High School Girls and Boys Basketball.

Mr. Harrington, Principal, reported on the I-World Initiative which is the name of the MacBook I-to-I Program that Sterling will start with all 9th-I2th grade students in the 2018-2019 school year. The teachers are very excited about the opportunities they will be able to provide to students with this initiative. All teachers will have their own MacBook this month and do semi-weekly meetings to talk about technology offerings.

In my Superintendent's report I shared information with the board about the Veteran's Day Program, bus routes, and football.

In action items the board opened the bids for snow removal. Only one bid was received even though an ad was placed in the Voice News and The Chieftain in two editions. The board approved the bid as presented. The board also approved and reviewed a number of board policies.

The Superintendent evaluations will be shared with me at the December board meeting. A Board Winter Retreat has been scheduled for Wednesday, January 3, 2018 to do strategic planning. Also in December the board will be doing final reading of board policies; 8260, 8260.A, 8260.C-2A, 8260.C4, 8342, 3003, and 3045. The Option Enrollment Policy and State of the District Report will also be reviewed at this meeting.



Football Update

The 2018 and 2019 Sterling Jet football teams will have a new look. Rather than playing 8-man football, the Jets will be playing 6-man football for the next two-year cycle. After a great deal of research, personal conversations with all current Jet football players 'parents, conversations with area school superintendents, discussions with athletes and coaches, the decision that best meets the needs of our athletes at Sterling Public Schools is to make this change.

Stephen Epler in Chester, Nebraska developed six-man football in 1934. The first 6-man game was played on Thursday, September 27, 1934 in Hebron, Nebraska Athletic Gridiron with almost 1000 people watching. Hardy-Chester played Belvalex-Alexandria.

What's the difference between 8-man football and 6-man football? That's a great question. Instead of having a first down after 10 yards, it's 15 yards. When the ball is snapped it must be handed off or passed to advance the ball past the line of scrimmage. The player who receives the snap cannot run the ball past the line of scrimmage, however if the ball is tossed to another player, that player can run or throw the ball and the player to whom the ball was snapped is still an eligible receiver. All six players are eligible to be receivers. On offense, three linemen are required on the line of scrimmage at the start of the play. The point after a touchdown (PAT) in 6-man is one point for a run or pass and two points for a kick. A field goal is worth four points. There are no changes to the field or the equipment. The length of the quarters are 10 minutes. Every player is eligible for a pass.

New Building

At the July 19, 2017 Board of Education Meeting the board approved the bid from A.H.R.S. Construction, Inc. to build a new building directly to the east of the current high school building. If you haven't been by the school lately to see the progress, please drive by.

The maintenance and custodial staff are in the process of painting the interior walls as the rest of the work progresses. This has included plumbing and electrical work within the building. A retaining wall and concrete have been added to the exterior of the building. It's hard to believe that the contractor has been able to pour concrete on the first day of December,

but that occurred!

We hope to have the building completed next month. At that time our two preschool classrooms will move into this location for the remainder of the year.


