### SUPERINTENDENT NOTES by Mr. Knippelmeyer

**School-Based Pre-Kindergarten Program:** We are currently taking names of those interested in attending our school-based pre-kindergarten program for the 2016-17 school year. To be eligible for pre-kindergarten, your child needs to turn 3 on or before July 31, 2016. Our pre-kindergarten program is for 3- and 4-year-olds. 4-year-olds attend all day and 3-year-olds can either attend full day or half day sessions. Our pre-kindergarten program follows the school calendar and is in session five days a week. Generally one day a month is designated for teacher plan time/home visits and pre-kindergarten students do not attend school. We offer an outstanding program that includes play along with academics. Teaching Strategies GOLD and Creative Curriculum are used in our pre-kindergarten classroom. We would love to



have your 3- or 4-year-old attend Sterling Public Schools! 
**School Gym Update:** At the time of this newsletter, we are planning to play the remainder of our home basketball games, both high school and junior high, in our Sterling Gym. Once the basketball season concludes, the repair process will begin in our gym. Tentatively, there will be a 4-6 week block of time where the school gym will not be available because of different projects taking place. During this time the gym ceiling insulation will be installed, the walls and sound panels will be painted, the old bleachers will be removed and new bleachers will be installed, and our gym floor will be sanded down, repainted, and refinished. Along with this we are looking at possible smaller projects with our sound and lighting system in the gym. We know this is going to cause an inconvenience by not having our gym available during this time, but our hope is to have the majority of the projects finished before high school graduation on May 7, 2016. Thank you for your flexibility and if you have an event scheduled in the gym during this time, please contact the school to see if the gym will be available.

### Summary of January Board of Education meeting:

- Gil Peace and Marty Kasl presented to the board about possible building and facilities projects. The board has heard three presentations from architects. We will have a board workshop on Feb. 10 to look at and prioritize different projects, ideas, etc., and then look at getting an architect on board.
- The board reorganized, but all positions and committees stayed the same. John Harms is president, Mike Hestermann is vice president, Cheri Wirthele is secretary, and Rick Vollman is treasurer.
- The superintendent evaluation was reviewed, along with a timeline for Principal/Superintendent contract negotiations for next year.
- A discussion on the gym took place with no action taken. Our plan is to play upcoming home basketball games at home as scheduled. Other projects in the gym that were discussed: gym floor expectations, gym ceiling spray insulation, painting of the walls and sound panels, bleacher removal and installation of new bleachers, sound system, and gym lights.
- The board also looked at classified staff salaries and what a tiered salary system could look like. No action was taken as this will be discussed more this spring.







# GIRLS' STATE, BOYS' STATE, & JUNIOR LAW CADET

### CORNHUSKER GIRLS' STATE

Cornhusker Girls' State applications are due by Tuesday, March 8th, 2016.. All junior girls are encouraged to apply for this experience. Girls' State is a nonpartisan program that teaches young women responsible citizenship and love for God and Country. Since the inception of the Girls State program in 1937, nearly one million young people have had the opportunity to learn first-hand how their state and local government works. High school girls, who have completed their junior year, spend an intensive week of study, working together as self-governing citizens at Auxiliary sponsored Girls State programs in every state. They learn how to participate in the functioning of their state's government in preparation for their future roles as responsible adult citizens. The maximum enrollment for this year will be 410 delegates, with more than one girl from each school if funding allows. year's Girls State will be held from Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, June 11<sup>th</sup> at UNL's Sandoz Residence Hall.

### **CORNHUSKER BOYS' STATE**

Applications are currently being accepted for Cornhusker Boys' State. This annual citizenship program sponsored by the Nebraska American Legion is designed to provide youth with a better understanding of how city, county, and state governments operate. Each boy is sponsored locally by an organization such as an American Legion Post, or by some other patriotic, civic, fraternal, or religious group in cooperation with the local American Legion Post.

American Legion Cornhusker Boys' State is set up as a functional "51 state" and each boy learns how government subdivisions operate by actually doing the job. Participants will campaign for offices, hold elections, take part in band and

chorus, compete in athletics, and be involved in other varied activities as part of the citizenship training program. They will set up their own state government and draft bills.

All junior boys are eligible to apply for Boys'
State. This year's session will be from June 5 th
through June 11th at the University of NebraskaLincoln campus. Deadline for application is
Tuesday, March 8th, 2016, with the Legion Post in charge.

### 2016 JUNIOR LAW CADET PROGRAM

Nebraska Department of the American Legion

Basic Requirements:

- -High school junior in good health & able to participate in physical activities.
- -Must possess a positive attitude & display respect for law enforcement.
- -Good grooming, average or above average scholastic record, & able to share the knowledge gained through the program.
- -Must possess a valid Nebraska operator's license or learner's permit.


This program gives students the chance to: drive a State Patrol car; learn to fire a service weapon, learn self-defense, pressure point control tactics, and assault prevention measures; and interact with law enforcement officers.

Two sessions offered - one for boys and one for girls. The program now takes place at the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center in Grand Island.
