SEPTEMBER BOARD OF EDUCATION SUMMARY

•The Board of Education held a special board meeting on September 2, 2016 with the purpose of visiting the property at 160 Main St. (directly south of our existing building). The board of education approved the purchase of the property at 160 Main St. at its regular meeting on September 14, 2016. Over the past year, we have looked at multiple options of where to add building space to support our students and programs, including our pre-kindergarten program and our current kitchen space.



We have looked at the current preschool site, across Main St. to the west of our main building, and possibly adding on to the southeast corner of the existing building. This property at 160 Main St. is already connected to our existing playground area and provides the opportunity to potentially put up a structure that could be used for multiple purposes. We need to eliminate the portable that is currently being used for pre-kindergarten. It does not meet the needs of our early childhood program (we currently have 17 three and four year olds in the pre-kindergarten program. Next year we are looking at the possibility of 19-20 three and four year olds eligible for our program, based on census numbers). We would like to provide a minimum of 1200-1500 square feet to support our pre-kindergarten program.

- •We do not intend to use the house on the 160 Main St. property as classroom space. We are currently in the brainstorming phase of possible uses for that house.
- •Our current kitchen area needs to be addressed as well. We have been working with our architect, Gill Peace, to formulate possible ideas to renovate the kitchen area, based on some existing safety concerns. Currently, food storage and some freezer space are not available in our existing kitchen. This renovation could include one existing elementary classroom, which means one classroom will need to be relocated.
- •Funding: The Board of Education has been supportive the last few years in building our depreciation fund and special building fund. Our intent is to be able to pay for these projects through these two funding sources.
- •2016-17 Budget: General Fund \$4,381,500; Depreciation Fund \$450,349; Employee Benefit Fund \$18,701; Activities Fund \$150,000; School Nutrition Fund \$127,499; Bond Fund \$183,350; Special Building Fund \$527,996; OCPUF \$75,025; and Student Fees Fund \$835.
- •2016-17 Property Tax Rate: General Fund \$.889321; Bond Fund \$.061466; Special Building Fund \$.050634; QCPUF \$.029573. Total Levy = \$1.030994

NeSA Scores. The Nebraska Department of Education recently made public the NeSA results from the 2015-16 school year. Each spring students are assessed in Reading, Mathematics, and Science. Students are also assessed in Writing in January. Below are a few charts that show how our students scored in comparison to the state average, for Reading, Mathematics, and Science. Writing scores are still currently under review, so



they have not been made public at this time. The numbers shown below are the percentage of students who are who are either **meeting** or **exceeding** the expected standards.

We are planning to send both of these reports home with students. We will be sending out an Alert Solutions reminder to parents the day prior to sending these home. Our hope is that this change will be a more efficient way to communicate this information, for both parents and the school. If for some reason these reports do not make it home, please feel free to contact the office.

Illness. I just wanted to remind all parents of the school policy regarding students who are ill or become ill at school. If a student has a temperature of 100.0 or higher, they will be sent home and may not return until they are fever free for 24 hours, without the aid of fever reducing medication. We must follow this policy in order to prevent other students from becoming ill.



If people need to get shots outside of our clinic times, please have them call the office to set this up. Getting vaccinated is a priority.

CDC encourages people 6 months and older to get the flu shot as soon as possible. The shot covers 4 different types of virus. 2 A's and 2 B's - 1 B is new to provide a better match to what was circulating last year. Though some years shots have not been a "good match", the shot still offered cross protection. Some protection is better than no protection.

The flu mist is not recommended this year.

Seniors - Have you visited your top colleges? If you haven't done so already, visit your college choices **soon** as application deadlines will start hitting this fall. Follow these tips for a successful visit:

- ♦ Contact the admissions office at least two weeks in advance to schedule your visit. Make appointments with an admissions representative, financial aid counselor and a faculty member in the area of study that interests you.
- ♦ Check out the college website before you visit. Most college sites have a section for prospective students where you can learn about the school's admissions process, types of majors, student services and employment opportunities. You might even be able to schedule your visit online.
- ♦ Visit while school is in session. You won't get the true flavor during breaks or finals week.
- ♦ Get a feel for the campus. Hang out in the student union, find coffee shops with wireless internet access, eat in a restaurant close to campus or attend athletic or cultural events.

Check out free national state and local awards. Check out free national sites such as **FastWeb**, **SRN Express and FastAid**. Scholarship resources are also available at your local library and at the EducationQuest offices in Kearney, Lincoln and Omaha.
- **\$ Visit your high school counselor weekly** for information about local scholarships.
- **\$ Get organized.** Place scholarship applications in deadline order and prioritize each award. Local and college-specific scholarships deserve top priority because you're more likely to earn them.
- **\$ Continually update your activities, honors and volunteer or paid jobs** using the Activities Resume at www.educationquest.org.
- **\$ Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores** by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.
- **\$** Use quality references such as a teacher, coach, or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them advanced notice and a specific deadline.
- **\$** Get an early start on essays. Describe your interests, hopes for the future, and leadership abilities. Be sure to tailor your essay to the question.


