The new school year is off and running. Football and Volleyball games have begun and we're looking forward to watching our student athletes perform both on and off the field / court. Thank you for your work as parents and community members in helping the 2016-2017 school year start off successfully.
2016-17 District Budget: Now that school has started, I shift my focus to developing the budget for the 2016-17 school year. As many of you know, it has become more and more evident the past couple of years that Sterling Public Schools must rely primarily on the support of our local
 patrons to support our school financially. For the upcoming school year we will get very little in regard to state aid for our school, ( $\$ 533$ compared to $\$ 830,000$ two years ago). We are very thankful for the support that we get from our patrons and community and know that we would not be able to provide the excellent education that our students receive, without your support. We will continue to work hard and be fiscally responsible with our funds, while also working to provide the best educational opportunities we can for our students. So again, THANK YOU for your support of our school!
Fall Sports Participation: We have received some questions in regard to participation in fall sports this year. For the current school year we have 31 boys and 28 girls in grades $9-12$. This year we have 16 boys ( 8 seniors) out for football and 10 girls out for volleyball. One of the great things about being a part of a smaller school is that the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities is great. A trend that many schools are seeing, especially in football, is a declining number in participation. We have been fortunate in years past that the numbers really did not decline in participation in football. What we are seeing now is that trend is changing, and this could have a significant impact on our athletic teams in the future. With 8 senior boys finishing up their high school football careers this year, it will be imperative that we get additional kids to participate in football next year, otherwise the future of our football program is going to be in question. We're looking forward to both our football and volleyball seasons and know that our athletes and coaches will compete to their greatest ability! We wish all our teams the best of luck this year. ## Principle Notes by Mr. Theobald

Marzano Update. Last year our teaching staff attended 6 days of training via the MRL Academy V as we started the work to implement a common language of instruction throughout the building. The next phase of this implementation will take place this year with a program called HIIP (High Impact Instruction Partnership). Our staff will be working with staff developers from ESU 4 to begin implementation of several aspects of the Marzano model. Each staff
 member has some autonomy in that they will be able to choose, what elements to focus on, and also have some flexibility to change goals as needed. In addition, based on the design of the HIIP program, we will not need to alter the school calendar to accommodate this program. I am really excited about this opportunity for our staff as it will be a benefit to our students!

Attendance. I know I write about this every year, but one of the single most important ways for students to be successful is for them to be at school. I also understand that kids do get sick and things come up which will require them to miss school. If your child is not going to be in school, we ask that you call the office by 7:55 a.m., otherwise the school will be contacting you to check on the whereabouts of your child. Also, if your child is gone for a medical reason, we ask that you provide the school with a note verifying that appointment, as this helps out when we track student attendance.
