PreK Registration for 2015-2016 School Year

A new year of PreK is right around the corner and it's time to begin enrolling students for the 2015-2016 school year. Enrollment papers are due by April 22nd with a \$50 deposit to hold your child's place in the program. The enrollment will cut off at 20 with those registering after the class is full to be placed on a waiting list. The \$50 deposit will go towards your first month's payment, which is due on August 17th.

Tuition for the 2015-2016 school year will be \$95 a month starting with the first day of school on the 17th of August. If the tuition is paid in full at the beginning of the year, then the discounted rate is \$800, which is a savings of \$55 per child. If parents choose to pay for the entire 1st semester, the reduced rate is \$400, or a savings of \$27.50 per semester. These rates are for full day registration; half day is priced accordingly.

If your family fills out the free or reduced lunch application form and you qualify for free lunch, then all fees are waived. If your family qualifies for the reduced lunch, the fees will be reduced by 83% of the full rates.

PreK students need to be 3 years old by the first day of the 2015-2016 school year and are expected to be potty trained in order to be registered. The exception to that rule is "if a child has an identified handicap or special need he/she is receiving district services for and that condition interferes with the toilet training process".

Ag Econ Trip to Chicago

On March 17th, the Ag Econ class made their yearly trek to Chicago. We left at 3AM to fly out of Omaha at 6AM so that we could see the opening of the Chicago Board of Trade at 8:30AM. Led by Rhet Dirks on the CTA, we arrived at the Chicago Board of Trade at the opening bell. Our school has been fortunate the past 10 years to have FCStone sponsor us so that our students can be on the trading floor to see the action first hand. Joe Bedore, Vice President of operations, gave us a one hour tour and Q & A session on trading options and futures in commodities. This may be the final time we will have this opportunity because on July 1st the open out-cry process will cease and electronic trading will take the place of human trading.

Following our experience on the CBOT floor, we went to the Federal Reserve for a tour. The "experts" felt that interest rates will be rising in the coming years.
