#### Principle Notes by Mr. Theobald

**WELCOME BACK!!!** The start of the 2015-16 school year is upon us. I would like to start this year by welcoming several new staff members. Ryan Knippelmeyer will be serving as superintendent and PK principal. We have three new elementary teachers that are beginning their careers here at Sterling. Anne Wohlers will be teaching kindergarten, Annie Ahrens will be teaching third grade, and Angela Durflinger will be teaching fourth



grade. We also have two new high school teachers. Emilia Woeppel will be teaching Ag. Education, and Jacob Davenport will be teaching Business classes. With that being said, here are a few changes and points of emphasis for the upcoming year.

**Handbook Changes.** This year there have been very minimal changes to any of the student handbooks other than the layout. One change that I would like to highlight deals with graduation requirements. Starting this year with the ninth grade class, each student will be required to document a minimum of 20 hours of volunteer community service. We felt this was a great way for the students of Sterling to give back to their community and the surrounding area.

Students will be given handbooks on the first day of school and teachers will be highlighting points of emphasis. Students and their parents will also be required to sign the form at the back of the handbook and bring back to school by August 21<sup>st</sup>.

**School Day Changes.** We have made a slight alteration to our school week. We have eliminated the Friday early-out schedule and have opted to go back to a regular Friday dismissal time. We have also added a 1:37 p.m. dismissal on the first Wednesday of each month, from September through April, with the exception of September, when we will be holding the early dismissal on the second Wednesday. We will be using this time for staff development, school improvement, data analysis, etc. This schedule change will give our teachers more focused time to work on the items previously listed. I think our students will also benefit from a more consistent weekly schedule.

## SPECIAL EDUCATION

Handicapped children between the ages of birth and twenty-one years of age are eligible for special education services. In order to be eligible, the child must meet specific criteria established by the State of Nebraska in Rule 51 for Autism, Behavior Disorder, Deaf-Blindness, Developmental Delay, Hearing Impairment, Mental Handicap, Multiple Impairments, Orthopedic Impairment, Other Health Impairments, Specific Learning Disability, Speech-Language Impairment, Traumatic Brain Injury, and Visual Impairment.

If you believe that your child may qualify for any of these programs, please contact your local school superintendent so arrangements for diagnosis can be made. All these services are provided by Sterling Public Schools.

#### **LUNCH PROGRAM INFORMATION**

The Sterling School Lunch Program is a non-profit entity, which serves nutritious meals every day at the lowest possible cost. At least five different food items are offered each day. Grades PK-12 are allowed the "Offer vs. Serve Option", which means that they may choose three of the five food items offered and their meal still qualifies as a Government reimbursable lunch.



Smart Snacks - USDA's Smart Snacks standards apply to all foods and beverages sold to students during the school day in school vending machines, stores, snack carts, and a la carte lines, as well as through fundraising. The school day is defined as the period from midnight before to 30 minutes after the end of the official school day.

A computerized accounting system is being used. All money received is divided equally for a family account unless directed otherwise. For those students in PreK - 4<sup>th</sup> grade, whose parents indicate they want their child to participate in the afternoon milk lunch program, the price of a milk ticket (\$10.00) will be deducted from the student account and a milk ticket will be hand written. Sterling Public School's State Aid to Schools is affected positively be the number of students receiving free and reduced meals and every dollar collected from state aid is one dollar less that is required locally in property taxes. If your child(ren) qualify for Free & Reduced Lunches, this means that one basic meal will be served. IF YOUR CHILD(REN) WANTS SECONDS, THEY WILL BE CHARGED FULL PRICE FOR SOME ITEMS ON THE MENU.
