Title I Services

From The Principal's Desk

WELCOME BACK!!! The start of the 2014-15 school year is upon us. I hope everyone had a chance to spend some quality time with family over the last couple of months. I know personally I am ready to get back into a routine. The building is just not the same without two of the most important components of a school, the students and the staff. As usual, we have made some changes as we continue to do what is best for our students, our school and our community. Below are a few of the high points that I would like to expand on.

1. Alert Solutions. Over the summer, we have transitioned from School Reach to a company called Alert Solutions for our alert messaging system. This system has more features that we will eventually implement, but in the meantime, there are a

couple of things that we need your help with. An alert messaging system is effective as long as we have your correct contact information. Our primary source for collecting your current contact information is the contact cards that students bring home at the start of the year. Please return these ASAP so that we can enter the correct information into our system. Another option for collecting this information is for you as a parent to log on to your student(s) account and enter this information yourself. This would be helpful on our end, and it may reduce the chance of data entry error as compared to our staff entering that information from the contact cards. If you would like to do this, follow these steps:

- * Log onto your PowerSchool account from the school webpage
- * Click the Power Announcement tab on the left hand side of the page
- * Click on the Preferences by Contact Field and enter the correct information
- * Be sure to click Save Preferences before you leave this page

By default, Alert Solutions will only send a voice message and an email. If you want to receive a text message, you must log into your PowerSchool account and make this change under the *Preferences by Message Type* tab. Keep in mind that normal data rates will apply for text messages.

- **2. Handbook Changes.** As is the norm, we annually look at our student and activity handbooks to ensure that what we have is current and up to date. I will briefly highlight a few of these changes, but I encourage all parents/guardians of students to read through the handbooks that will be posted on the school webpage as all students and their parents/guardians will be asked to sign off as having read and understanding of the information that is in the handbooks.
 - * Dress Code language has been clarified
 - * Students formerly could miss up to 10 days before we look at forfeiture of credit. This has been changed to 8 days.

- * Will be assessing class dues for students in grades 7-11. Class dues will be \$10 per student per year. These funds will essentially be used to pay for prom. We hope this will reduce, but not eliminate, the amount of fundraising that has had to take place in the past to fund prom. Students will need to have paid their dues before they can attend prom. These dues are fee waiverable.
- * The Noon Rule has been tweaked so that students must be in school by the start of 5th period if they wish to participate in any activity or practice that day.
- * The Academic Status rule has been changed to that students have to be failing two classes in order to be ineligible to participate in activities. We have eliminated the clause that stated students would be ineligible if they are failing the same class for two consecutive weeks.
- * In order for a doctor or dentist visit to be an excused absence, a note must be provided to the school.
- * We have eliminated the Activity Fee and gone to an Activity Pass.
- * We have put a cap on practice length of 2 ½ hours.

These handbooks changes will be explicitly explained to students during the first week of school. If after you have talked to your child you have questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me.

3. School Day Changes and Second Chance Breakfast. We have slightly changed our start time and dismissal time, along with adjusting the length of periods, for this upcoming year. In total, we have only lengthened the day by 3 minutes. This change was necessary in order to allow for the implementation of our Second Chance Breakfast. School will begin at 8:00 a.m. instead of 8:05 a.m. and will dismiss at 3:37 p.m. instead of 3:39 p.m. Our Friday start time is also 8:00 a.m. and we will dismiss at 2:47 p.m.

I am very excited that we are going to implement a Second Chance Breakfast for students in grades 7-12. If all goes well, we will look at expanding this to our elementary building as well. This program was researched by our Health and Wellness Committee. Several members of this committee took a visit to Wilber-Clatonia to see first hand how this program worked. Those members include: Harold Richardson, Sandy Weyers, Stan Karr and Denise Horstman.

Our Second Chance Breakfast will be a 15 minute period that will take place between first and second periods. When students are dismissed from their first period class, they will be allowed to go to the cafeteria, grab breakfast, and then report to their Advisory Period. This is an optional program for students. We will still be serving breakfast before school as usual. The Second Chance Breakfast will be the same price and menu as what is served before school. Student who qualify for free or reduced meals, will only be allowed to eat one time, either before school or during the Second Chance Breakfast.

Once students get their breakfast, they will report to their Advisory Period. Each teacher who is assigned an advisory group will have approximately ten students in their group.

This small setting will give each teacher an opportunity to build a strong relationship with their students while providing them academic support and accountability.

Our Second Chance Breakfast and Advisory Period is a work in progress, but in the end, our hope is that it will have a positive impact on our students.

4. Back to School Activities. On August 8th, the Booster Club will be holding their Back to School Carnival from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Sports Courts. On August 12th, we will be hosting a PK-6 Open House beginning at 5:30 p.m. and concluding around 7:00 p.m. This will be a time for parents and students to come to school, meet their teacher, find their desk, drop off school supplies, etc... Seventh grade orientation will also be on this night starting at 7:00 p.m. in the music room.

SCHOOL INSURANCE

Stop by the office for information on insurance or we are happy to send home with your student the information packets. Remember insurance is needed for those students out for sports. This program does cover elementary through high school students. The coverage can be taken out for the school year or all year long.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Handicapped children between the ages of birth and twenty-one years of age are eligible for special education services. In order to be eligible, the child must meet specific criteria established by the State of Nebraska in Rule 51 for Autism, Behavior Disorder, Deaf-Blindness, Developmental Delay, Hearing Impairment, Mental Handicap, Multiple Impairments, Orthopedic Impairment, Other Health Impairment, Specific Learning Disability, Speech-Language Impairment, Traumatic Brain Injury, and Visual Impairment.

If you believe that your child may qualify for any of these programs, please contact your local school superintendent so arrangements for diagnosis can be made. All these services are provided by the Sterling Public School.

REMINDERS

We do not issue aspirin at school. You may fill out papers for medication (Tylenol, Advil, Tums, Cough drops, etc...) to be given to your child. You will also have to supply the office with medication for your child in the **original bottle**. If your child needs to take some kind of medication during the day, make arrangements with office before school starts.

The application forms will be available at the PK-6 Open House as well as on the school website. It is IMPERATIVE that you file your free/reduce lunch application even if you qualified last year. We urge everyone to submit your application as soon as possible so that lunch bills don't start accumulating before your application is received. HELP YOURSELF AS WELL AS THE SCHOOL BY FILING FOR FREE/REDUCED MEALS. Sterling Public Schools' State Aid to Schools is affected positively by the number of students receiving free and reduced meals, and every dollar collected from state aid is one dollar less that is required locally in property taxes. One other comment about hot lunches, if your child qualifies for free or reduced lunches, this means that one basic meal will be served. IF YOUR CHILD WANTS SECONDS FOR SOME ITEMS ON THE MENU. THEY WILL BE CHARGED FULL PRICE FOR THAT ADDITIONAL SERVING.

LUNCH PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Sterling School Lunch Program is a non-profit entity, which serves nutritious meals every day at the lowest possible cost. At least five different food items are offered each day. Grades PK-12 are allowed the "Offer-vs-Serve Option", which means that they may choose three of the five food items offered and their meal still qualifies as a Government reimbursable lunch.

Smart Snacks - USDA's Smart Snacks standards will be implemented. These standards apply to all foods and beverages sold to students during the school day in school vending machines, stores, snack carts and a la carte lines, as well as through fundraising. The school day is define as the period from midnight before to 30 minutes after the end of the official school day.

A computerized accounting system is being used.

All money received is divided equally for a family account unless directed otherwise. For those students in Pre-Kindergarten through grade four, whose parents indicate they want their child to participate in the afternoon milk lunch program, the price of a milk ticket

(\$10.00) will be deducted from the student account and a milk ticket will be hand written. All expired tickets are kept on file if any questions should occur.


