Board of Education News for January 2019

The Sterling Board of Education met twice during the month of January. The first meeting was a work session that was facilitated by a staff member from the Nebraska Association of School Boards. During this session the board focused on goal setting for next steps for the success of Sterling Public Schools.

One of the strategies that the board has decided to move forward with is to have a Community Engagement Session. The purpose of this session is to provide an opportunity for the community to provide input into current and future initiatives for our school district. The regular board meeting was held on Monday, January 21. Agenda items included:

- New Board Members Stan Karr and Kevin McAuliffe took the Oath of Office.
- The following officers were elected: Cheri Wirthele-President, Rick Vollman-Vice President, John Harms-Secretary, Mark Horstman-Treasurer.
- Commendations were given to the Sterling Girl's Basketball Team for winning the Class A Mudecas Tournament.
- ➤ Teacher reports were given by Mrs. Laura Goracke in regards to a Grow Rural Grant she is applying for. Dr. Evi Wusk shared information with the board about the writing classes that she is teaching, how a lesson is structured, the professional development that teachers have received, and the growth she has seen in her writers this year.
- The board approved the First Bank of Nebraska as the depository for the district.
- ➤ The official newspapers for the District will continue to be the Tecumseh Chieftain and The Voice Newspaper.
- Superintendent Heusman was approved as the District's Non-Discrimination Compliance Coordinator.
- ➤ The negotiated agreement with the Sterling Education Association for the 2019-2020 school year was approved.
- In board policy work: Board Policy 5006 was approved on second reading. Board Policies 9300, 1002, 1040 and 1050 were reviewed on first reading. Board policies 2013 & 2013A were reviewed by all board members.
- The board was presented the first draft of the 2019-2020 calendar. It will be finalized this next month and approved at the February 18 meeting.
- The District Annual Report was shared. That is included in this Newsletter.
- ➤ The Board reviewed dates for the Community Engagement Meeting that will be held this winter.
- The Board decided to move the starting time for their regular monthly meetings to 7:00 p.m.



The next regular meeting of the Board of Education will be Monday, February 18, 2019 @ 7:00 p.m. The meeting is held in the Media Center at Sterling Public School.

Staying Healthy...

Flu Season is here and has been in full force at Sterling. The last two weeks the elementary saw around 20% of children home sick. Please remember that school policy dictates that if a student has a temperature of 100° they are to be sent home until they have been 24 hours fever free. That means if they get sent home from school, they need to spend at least the entire next day at home. Fever free for 24 hours also means that no medicine, especially fever reducer, has been given in that 24-hour span. Tips to staying healthy:

- Promote proper and frequent hand washing at home
- Get good and plentiful sleep
- Disinfect high-touch areas in your home
- Keep up with the laundry, especially clothes, towels, and bedding
- Get some fresh air!

School Improvement Goals

- * All students K-6th will improve their reading comprehension. Progress: Daily 5 implementation, Guided Reading training and implementation, currently working on additional instruction in fluency, talking about reading, and reading comprehension strategies.
- * All students K-6th will improve their writing skills. Progress: Implemented new Writing Materials and continual training, using writing rubrics, text dependent analysis additions, high frequency words for K-3, Handwriting Without Tears curriculum for K-3, and writing pacing guides being written.
- * All students 7th-12th will improve their writing skills. Progress: Split 7th & 8th grade reading and writing into two classes, text dependent analysis additions, curriculum alignment, and district writing rubric is being developed and will be implemented.
- * All students 7th-12th will use technology on a daily basis for extended learning opportunities. Progress: 1-to-1 Macbook Airs for all students 8th-12th, Bytespeeds for 7th, word processing class added for 6th & 7th grade students, Digital Citizenship class added for 6th grade, lesson plans in all content areas incorporate technology, and additional technology learning opportunities for staff throughout the year.


