

Many of you may have heard about the Teammates Mentoring program that was recently organized. But many of you may not know exactly what this program is and what the goals are. Teammates was founded by Tom and Nancy Osborne is 1991 as an effort to provide support and encouragement to school-aged youth. Teammates mentors meet with

their mentee one hour per week during school hours. Mentors are volunteers from the community who have dedicated themselves to making a difference and being a caring adult in the lives of a young person. These mentors give the kids a person to talk, share their experiences, and bond, while sharing a sense of hope, purpose, and vision with the mentees. This program is open to all students in grades 4-6 currently, but as mentors volunteer and are trained, we hope to expand the program. There is a misconception that the Teammates mentors work only with students with special needs. This is not the case. Each of us has one or more people in our lives that we consider our mentors, and this is what the Teammates mentors are doing for the students in our school. 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From the Principal's Desk by Ryun Theobald

It seems as if February has been a yo-yo month with the weather, but since we all live in Nebraska, I am not telling you anything that you don't already know. While I would prefer to just get the winter weather out of the way, the daily change does help to keep me on my toes. Anyhow, there are more important items to talk about than the weather, so below are a few things I would like to share.

Student pre-registration for grades 7-12. Students in grades 6-11 will begin the pre-registration process in the next couple of weeks. Ms. Shea will be assisting the students

in selecting classes that fit both their needs and interests. Each student will have a form to bring home that needs to be signed by a parent and then brought back to school. These pre-registration forms will be used to help build the master schedule for the 2015-16 school year. Our goal is to have the schedule built by mid-April so teachers will know exactly what classes they will be teaching and students will know exactly what classes they will be taking. Once the schedule is built, a student may still switch classes, assuming there is something offered during a corresponding period. Every attempt will be made to accommodate each student with their perfect schedule.

PT Conferences. The majority of the feedback I received from moving the high school conferences to the gym was positive. I also wanted to briefly explain the rationale for the seating arrangements. The teachers were strategically placed on the inside of the tables and the parents on the outside of the tables for a couple of reasons. First, by having the teachers on the inside, their voices would be directed outward, thereby keeping the conversations as private as possible. The second reason was to help speed up conferences. It can be difficult sometimes to keep conferences to 5-7 minutes in length. I felt that if parents could see other parents, they would be more likely to keep the conversations shorter. I also recognize that by having teachers on the inside that it may not have been as welcoming, but I assure you, that was not the intention. If you have other feedback on conferences, please feel free to contact me and it will be taken into consideration as we plan for next fall.

JCC Spelling Bee. The Johnson County Spelling Bee was held in Tecumseh on February 14th. I am excited to share that Sterling's Amanda Tallant was the overall winner. Amanda has qualified for the Midwest Spelling Bee in Omaha. Other Sterling students who participated and placed in the top three of their respective grade levels are as follows: Danielle Janssen (1st) and Riley Vermeer (3rd) in 5th grade, Belle Haner (3rd) in 6th grade, and Amanda Tallant (2nd) in 7th grade. Congratulations to these students for a job well done!

NeSA testing. The NeSA testing window for this year is **March 23rd to May 1st**. Last year was a banner year at Sterling with the NeSA assessments. As a school we scored very well, but there is still room for improvement. Our goal is to be among the top 25 schools in the state in each category tested, as well as each grade level group. This is a very high expectation, but based on the work ethic of our students and the dedication of our staff, it is an attainable goal.


